

CONSUMER HEALTH DATA PRIVACY NOTICE (U.S.)

Last updated: April 30 2026

INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE

This Consumer Health Data Privacy Notice (“Notice”) explains how BeOne Medicines Ltd. and its subsidiary companies (“**BeOne**”, “**we**”, “**us**”, “**our**”) collect, use and share Consumer Health Data.

This Notice supplements our *Website & General Privacy Policy* (the “Privacy Policy”) available on this webpage. As explained in that Privacy Policy, in certain circumstances, other privacy notices may add to or replace it.

This Notice is one of those additional notices and applies specifically to Consumer Health Data collected through our websites and digital services, including disease awareness websites.

If there is any conflict between this Notice and the Privacy Policy, this Notice will apply to the processing of Consumer Health Data.

For the purposes of this Notice, “**Consumer Health Data Laws**” means applicable U.S. state laws that regulate Consumer Health Data, including, but not limited to, the Washington My Health My Data Act and the Nevada Consumer Health Data Privacy Law.

WHAT IS CONSUMER HEALTH DATA?

For the purposes of this Notice, “**Consumer Health Data**” means **personal information that is linked or reasonably linkable to you and that identifies your past, present or future physical or mental health status**, as defined under applicable Consumer Health Data Laws.

This may include information about medical conditions as well as non-medical information (such as browsing activity or interactions) that may indicate your health status or interests.

WHO THIS NOTICE APPLIES TO

This Notice applies only where required by applicable U.S. state Consumer Health Data Laws.

In particular, this Notice applies to:

- residents of certain U.S. states, including Washington and Nevada; and/or
- individuals whose Consumer Health Data is collected in those states, including through our websites or digital services.

This reflects that these laws may apply not only based on where you live, but also based on **where your Consumer Health Data is collected or processed**.

WHEN THIS NOTICE APPLIES

This Notice applies when you use our websites or digital services in a way that may involve Consumer Health Data, including when you:

- visit disease awareness content (e.g., CLL-related pages),
- sign up to receive newsletters or communications, or
- interact with cookies or similar technologies.

CONSUMER HEALTH DATA WE COLLECT

As described in the Privacy Policy, the type of personal information we collect depends on your interactions with us. In certain cases, this may include Consumer Health Data.

Depending on how you use our websites, we may collect:

Information you provide directly

- Contact details (e.g., email address) when you sign up for newsletters
- Information you choose to provide in forms or communications
- Information about your **interests in health conditions or treatments**

Information collected automatically

As explained in our Privacy Policy and Cookies Policy, we may collect information about how you use our websites, including:

- IP address
- pages visited (e.g., disease-related content),
- interactions with website features,
- device and technical browsing information (e.g., the browser type and version, operating system, device type, language settings and session timestamps).

The collection of certain information through cookies and similar technologies depends on the **types of cookies you choose to allow**. For more information about how to manage your preferences, please refer to our **cookie banner and preference center**. For more information about how we use cookies, see the cookies section below or refer to the “Our Cookie Policy” section of our Privacy Policy available on this site.

Certain information collected through your interactions with disease-related content **may be considered Consumer Health Data** because it may imply that you or someone you know has a specific health condition.

Inferences

We may derive or infer information about your potential health interests based on your interactions with our websites.

SOURCES OF CONSUMER HEALTH DATA

Consistent with the Privacy Policy, we collect information:

- **directly from you**, for example when you complete a form or sign up for communications;
- **automatically**, through your use of our websites, including cookies and similar technologies;
- **from other sources**, such as service providers, partners, or publicly available information.

WHY WE PROCESS CONSUMER HEALTH DATA

As described in the Privacy Policy, how we use your personal information depends on your interactions with us.

We may use Consumer Health Data for the following purposes:

Providing information and services

- to provide disease awareness content and educational information
- to respond to your requests and provide support

Sending communications

- to send newsletters or updates you request
- to provide information about health conditions and, where permitted, related products, services or programs

Improving our websites and services

- to understand how users interact with our websites
- to improve content, functionality and user experience

Compliance and safety

- to comply with legal and regulatory obligations (e.g., pharmacovigilance)
- to detect, prevent and respond to fraud or security incidents

With your consent (where required)

- to send marketing communications or personalize content

Our use of Consumer Health Data is based on your interactions with us and, where required under applicable Consumer Health Data Laws, your consent or our need to provide you with the services you request.

COOKIES AND SIMILAR TECHNOLOGIES

As explained in the “Our Cookie Policy” section of our Privacy Policy, we use cookies and similar technologies to improve your experience, understand how our websites are used, and, if you consent, to send you marketing communications or personalize content.

Certain cookies and similar technologies may collect information about your interactions with disease-related content, which **may be considered Consumer Health Data under applicable Consumer Health Data Laws**.

We also use cookies that operate in an anonymized manner, meaning they do not identify you. These include strictly necessary cookies required for the functioning of the website, as well as anonymized performance cookies used to analyze aggregated usage of our sites.

You can:

- manage your cookie preferences through our cookie banner or settings tools;
- adjust your browser settings to control cookies; and
- where available, use browser-based signals such as Global Privacy Control (GPC).

SHARING YOUR CONSUMER HEALTH DATA

We may share each of the categories of Consumer Health Data described in the “Consumer Health Data We Collect” section above with the following categories of recipients:

- **BeOne group companies**, for administrative and operational purposes;
- **service providers**, including technology, analytics and communication providers;
- **business partners and collaborators**, where relevant to our activities;
- **government authorities or regulators**, where required by law;
- **advisors** (e.g., attorneys, audit); and
- **other third parties**, in connection with corporate transactions.

We do not sell Consumer Health Data as defined under applicable Consumer Health Data Laws.

Where required by law, we will obtain your consent before collecting or sharing Consumer Health Data.

YOUR RIGHTS AND CHOICES

As explained in the Privacy Policy, you have rights regarding your personal information, including rights of access, deletion and withdrawal of consent.

With respect to Consumer Health Data, and subject to applicable law, you may also have the right to:

- confirm whether we are collecting, using or sharing your Consumer Health Data;
- access such data;

- request deletion;
- withdraw consent for its collection or sharing;
- receive information about third parties with whom we have shared it.

Where we rely on your consent to collect or share Consumer Health Data, **you have the right to withdraw that consent at any time.**

You may also exercise certain rights related to Consumer Health Data collected through cookies by:

- adjusting your cookie preferences; or
- using browser-based controls such as Global Privacy Control, where available.

To change your previously selected cookies preferences, click on the cookies icon the next time you visit our website.

To exercise your other rights, please contact us using the details in the “**Exercising your rights**” section of the Privacy Policy.

We may need to verify your identity before responding to your request.

If we deny your request, you may have the right to **appeal our decision** and to lodge a complaint with your state Attorney General.

We will not discriminate against you for exercising your rights under applicable law.

HOW LONG WE KEEP CONSUMER HEALTH DATA

We retain Consumer Health Data in line with the retention principles described in the Privacy Policy, including for as long as necessary to:

- fulfil the purposes described above;
- comply with legal obligations; and
- protect our legal rights.

CHANGES TO THIS NOTICE

We may update this Notice from time to time. When we do, we will revise the “Last updated” date and, where required, notify you.
